

Assembling Folding Space-Station Interior "F"

Crew Quarters or Sickbay or Data Center

This interior is a half-module that will fit next to the long side of any other interior. You can print multiple half-modules and decorate each one differently. Fittings are provided to make three different kinds of rooms; you can mix or match them according to your needs.

Print two copies of the beds-and-desks page, and one copy of each of the other pages. This will give you the parts for one half-module. The beds-and-desks page contains two of each kind of fitting, and each half-module can hold up to four fittings, so plan how you want to decorate each half-module, and print accordingly. Assemble the walls and floor just like any of the other space-station interiors. The whited-out areas on the floor

show where to attach the walls; the light-colored floor areas show where to attach the room fittings.

Each of the four small rooms can take one fitting. Three kinds of fittings are provided: normal beds, sickbay beds, and computer desks.

To make a crew quarters, glue normal beds in all four spaces.

To make a data center, glue computer desks in all four spaces. Such a center could include general computer access, communications, cryptography, sciences, personnel files, or external sensors.

To make a sickbay, glue sickbay beds in three of the rooms. The fourth room can also have a sickbay bed, or it can be the doctor's office, with a computer instead of a bed.

To make a combined facility for a small space station, mix and match the three kinds of fittings as you see fit.

Regardless of how you decorate it, the floor plan for a half-module looks like this:






Unused furnishings, especially the computer desks, can be used in empty rooms of other modules. Remember to glue them to the walls that fold, not the removable walls.

The outer walls for this module won't work with any other interior, since they're shortened to fit these half-sized interiors. Other interiors' outer walls won't work with these interiors for the same reason.








SF Interior F - beds & computer desks











Position bed or desk as indicated on a yellow space on the floor and against the adjacent wall


Folding SF Interior F - Walls - 1



Folding SF Interior F - Outer walls
